### 1. Opening, agenda, minutes – Lori Tavasszy

- a. Started the meeting with introductions and welcome to the meeting
- b. Key Objective: Start new cycle of SCC 2024-2026
- c. There are no objections to moving the publication status update (part 6) to after the break (part 5) to accommodate timing issues
- d. Minutes sent out yesterday for preapproval. Waiting until Monday for any additional comments

### 2. President's report on WCTRS – Tae Oum

- Tae provided an update on the transition of the secretariat from the University of Leeds to UC Davis
- b. Update on the taskforces:
  - i. Covid-19:
    - 1. Yoshi Hayashi and Junyi Zhang successfully completed the taskforce work
      - a. Books, journal articles, and policy brief
  - ii. Survey Efficiency Benchmarking:



- 1. Completed the first-year report and tabled in the Montreal Conference
- iii. Charted Education & License Program:
  - Needs reformulations because China's Education ministry removed any financial incentives
  - 2. Martin Dresner is looking for new opportunities outside of China.
  - 3. T&F Journal Sustainable Transport and Livability
    - a. Two aspects of the T&F proposed agreement that Tae strongly opposes
      - The publisher grants the WCTRS the limited, nonexclusive right to affiliate with the journal worldwide during the term in accordance with the terms/conditions set out in the agreement.
        - Tae's Response: "For Transport Policy, we have an exclusive collaboration agreement with Elsevier. Whatever reason T&F are not happy with us, they can invite another society to help them on the same journal. This is unacceptable to the WCTRS."
      - ii. The appointment of all editors, and the editorial policy of the journal, shall be the sole responsibility of the publisher, the publisher may consult with the WCTRS at the publisher's discretion.
        - Tae's Response: "For Transport Policy, WCTRS president and Publication Vice Chair SCC are directly involved in searching/evaluating the EiC, Editors and Associate Editors, and the WCTS Steering



Committee approves them before submitting the names to Elsevier to appoint."

- b. All of this considered, Tae is unable to approve the contract as it is provided. If T&F were able to address this issue, then he would sign the agreement until July 23, 2024, after which he will not open this idea.
- 4. International Collaboration Partners
  - a. Open to new suggestions for additional partners, or additional ways to engage with the partners.
    - i. John Preston mentioned that UIC (International Union of Railways – A3 & A4) and ITEA (International Transport Economists Association – E2) should be considered.
- 5. Questions:
  - a. Giovanni Circella Noted that after many attempts, the proposed contract with T&F has improved significantly.
  - b. Marc Ivaldi Suggested we inquire about contacting the international partners.
    - i. The partners should be contacted; they will be present at the STC meeting.
  - c. Lori Tavasszy Inquired if the STC has the authority to make the decision of the T&F contact instead of it being an executive decision.
    - i. Ali replies that it can be an executive decision.
    - ii. Lori asked for the Secretariat to confirm this in a follow up

    - 1. Proposing to appoint Dr. Lina Kattan, Professor of Civil Engineering, University of Calgary, Canada as a co-chair.

    - 1. SIG title and the scope are to be updated
  - iv. SIG G2 (National and Regional Transport Planning and Policy):
    - An additional co-chair, Prof. Silvio Nocera (IUAV University of Venice, Italy), is proposed

- d. Online Flagship Research Panel

  - ii. All WCTRS Members will be invited to attend
  - iii. The objective is to engage with all the WCTRS members and remind them of the upcoming conference, inform them of the spirit of the conference, and encourage them to write quality papers
- e. Profession Congress Organizer (PCO)
  - i. Call for Proposal has been sent out and many organizations are interested.
  - ii. Currently searching for the right software/service to meet all needs of the WCTR scientific program and registration
  - iii. Will be selected by the end of July, under strict confidentiality, so no detailed updates at this time
  - iv. There will be an onboarding session for the SIGs after the selection.
- f. Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)
  - The CSR plan is currently being designed; it will address reducing carbon footprint, enhancing resource efficiency, supporting local communities, promoting sustainable practices, and monitoring and reporting

  - 1. No longer necessary due to COVID-19, no guaranteed attendance
  - 2. May overlap with existing SIG activities and overall conference preparations/work balance

  - 1. Notes:
    - Laetitia Dablanc Supports a virtual conference in 2025, in a light format. Suggested we include a career development session organized by the young members in charge of WCTRS-Y.
  - 2. Aim for early 2025, as to not interfere with 2026 conference

  - i. Lori presented on Laetitia's behalf due to poor internet connection
  - Laetitia is transferring the leadership role to Ashish Verma after the upcoming conference and new social media managers are selected in April 2025
    - 1. Already working together for planning of WCTRS-Y timeline
    - 2. Will add the new virtual meeting session to the timeline

    - 1. This topic will be brought up in the STC meeting
    - 2. If a budget issue appears, there will be consideration of a bimonthly release instead of monthly

# 6. Publications status, 2023 Proceedings and SIs – Fusun Ulengin; Ozay Ozaydin

- a. Transport Policy
  - CiteScore has increased from 10.7 to 12.1 while Impact Factor is now 6.3 (previous 6.8), which is lower than last year but in line with the reduction seen in all transportation journals of the past year
    - 1. Details on the change are available in the presentation slides
  - ii. New editors appointed by Elsevier:

- iii. Performance is ahead of last year on all key statistics
- iv. Desk rejection rate is currently 66%
- v. The majority of submissions are from mainland China
- vi. Comments:
  - 1. Tae Oum Noted that the journal generates more revenue than the triannual conference for WCTRS
- b. Case Studies on Transport Policy Xiaowen Fu
  - i. On track to have more submissions than 2023 (estimate of 1000).
  - ii. Desk Rejection rate around 60% and acceptance rate at 20%.
  - iii. Impact Factor 2.4 (last year 4.5)
    - 1. In line with other transportation journals
    - 2. Increase in publications drives this number down
  - iv. 2023 saw a significant increase in submission but editorial speed was maintained, with similar levels expected for 2024 but editorial speed is expected to decrease
    - 1. 2023 editorial speed stayed the same due to increase in editors
    - 2. 2024 needs more editors to maintain same level of editorial speed
  - v. All editors are 100% voluntary, suggested that a minimal incentive is in order to show appreciation for this hard work
    - Tae Oum 50% of Elsevier CSTP revenue should be given to editors as a gesture of appreciation
      - a. A one time payment in December
    - Giovanni Circella we will confirm the amount at the STC meeting

- d. There were 21 special issues from the Mumbai conference, so we are seeing a decline in performance for Montreal.
- e. Tae expressed concern that this reduction may reduce the critical revenue that WCTRS receives from Elsevier.
- f. Need to address the Special Issue process as papers are being lost due to the lengthy speed of publication, e.g. 50 AV papers have moved to Procedia
