



























WCTR 2026 Bursary Awards

The World Conference on Transport Research Society (WCTRS) and Toulouse School of Economics (TSE) plan to support a few researchers from lower-middle and low-income economies in attending the 17th WCTR at Toulouse Capitole University, France, through a Bursary award. These bursaries are designed to encourage wider participation from talented researchers around the globe.

Successful applicants usually receive:

- A registration waiver (or refund) for the conference.
- Support for lodging costs, up to a maximum of about €800.
- An official bursary certificate during the closing ceremony.

All papers awarded bursaries will also be eligible for consideration in partner journals or Procedia (Elsevier), subject to standard review and revision procedures.

A formal announcement of the bursary awards will be made after the paper review process, towards the end of 2025.

Prof. Zong Tian Presents at ATSPM Monthly Meeting on Leveraging Connected Vehicle Data

Prof. Zong Tian, Topic Area C Manager of WCTRS, delivered a presentation at the ATSPM (Automated Traffic Signal Performance Measures) monthly meeting hosted by the U.S. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). His talk, titled "From Performance Evaluation to Signal Timing Optimization: Leveraging Connected Vehicle Data," explored how emerging data sources can drive practical improvements in signal operations.

Prof. Tian began with a brief overview of WCTRS and highlighted the upcoming World Conference to be held in Toulouse, France, in July 2026. The presentation demonstrated how connected vehicle data gathered through vehicle telematics can be used to generate vehicle trajectories, enabling precise identification of signal coordination issues. By overlaying these trajectories on time-space diagrams, agencies can diagnose inefficiencies and implement targeted timing adjustments. This performance-driven approach supports both objective evaluations and timely operational enhancements. Nearly 100 participants attended the meeting.

The 13th European Aviation Conference (EAC 2025)

The 13th European Aviation Conference (EAC 2025) will be held on **November 10–12, 2025**, in Warsaw, Poland. A dedicated **Research Day** will take place on November 10, 2025.

Conference Theme: Looking East: Aviation Policy, Geopolitics and Business Strategy in Eastern Europe

EAC 2025 will bring together academic researchers, industry representatives, and regulatory agencies to jointly advance understanding of the management, economic, and policy aspects of the aviation industry.

Key discussions will explore:

- The short- and long-term implications of airspace closures for airlines, airports, and air transport management
- The prospects for continued aviation growth in Central and Eastern Europe, compared with the rest of Europe
- The future of passenger and cargo markets
- The evolving role of regional airports
